







If you haven't heard yet, I wanted to let you know about a cool thing that happened at the end of Race Week this year. Phil Wise was a sailor who was on our WIRW Advisory Board and sailed regularly during Race Week on White Cloud. Last year, right after Race Week had ended, Phil died suddenly and unexpectedly of a brain hemorrhage. The Race Week organizers decided to start an annual sportsmanship award for WIRW in Phil's name.

OHYC Member John Hudson offered his boat, Gopher Baroque, to be the finish line boat for this year's WIRW, as he has in the past. In the final race of this year's regatta, White Cloud managed to hit Gopher Baroque as she was crossing the finish line, putting a gash in her side. After the boats returned to the dock, John had a discussion with Steve Johnson, the owner of White Cloud, and John offered that he would do the repair himself in exchange for Steve donating \$250 to Oak Harbor Youth Sailing! Steve readily agreed to this proposal.

On account of this magnanimous gesture by John, the Race Week organizers awarded the first annual Phil Wise WIRW Sportsmanship Award to John Hudson. It is things like this that make Race Week so special to our sailing community.

Sailing is a great life-long sport. Youth classes teach sailing skills and boating safety. The following classes are still open for registrations. Classes are held at the Oak Harbor Yacht Club and the Oak Harbor Marina:

Sail Camp 3 - Beginning- July 25 - 29;

Sail Camp 5 - Intermediate/Opti July 28 - 22;

Sail Camp 6 - Advanced/Double Handed - July 25 - 29.

The fee for the beginning classes is \$185 per child, per session. The fee for the intermediate and advanced classes is \$150. Class times for beginning classes is from 11:00 AM - 4:30 PM; and for the intermediate and advanced classes are from 5:00 - 8:00 PM. Successful completion of a beginning class will qualify youths to take the intermediate classes. Successful completion of the intermediate class will qualify youths to take the advanced class.




### Join Us for Texas Hold'em


Texas Hold'em is without a doubt the most popular form of poker played in the United States today. The game originated in Robstown, Texas, and by 1925 was popular in Dallas. In 1967 a group of Texas poker players, including legendary Doyle Brunson and Amarillo Slim, recognized the potential of the game and introduced it to a wider audience in Las Vegas. Benny Binion, colorful owner of the Horseshoe Casino, began the World Series of Poker in 1970, and the event was a huge success. That helped increase the popularity of poker, and today the WSOP draws thousands of entrants, and most of the events are variations of Texas Hold'em.



You don't have to travel to Las Vegas or Texas to participate in this history-making game; there's Texas Hold'em being played at the Oak Harbor Yacht Club the first and third Wednesday of each month, starting promptly at 7:00 PM. Sign-up sheets are posted in the back hallway, and players are selected from the first eight members to sign up. It's not just for the guys--all members, male or female, are welcome to play. New to the game? If you have a basic understanding of poker, we'll teach you the rest. The game is sometimes described as "requiring minutes to learn and a lifetime to master." The buy-in is \$20, so possible losses are limited, and you have a good chance of being one of four players to split the winnings pool. So, sign up today, and join us for the Texas Hold'em shuffle-up and deal! **1st & 3rd Wednesdays 7 pm**



## Fall 2016 Boating Education



The Deception Pass Sail & Power Squadron, in partnership with Oak Harbor Yacht Club, will be presenting two courses this fall of interest to new and experienced boaters.



**America's Boating Course**, the basic boating education course, will be presented in two sessions in the upstairs ballroom of the Yacht Club. This course is intended as an introduction to boating. The first half will be held from 9AM to 3PM on Saturday, September 10<sup>th</sup> and the second half at the same times on Saturday, September 17<sup>th</sup>. The cost of the class, payable to the Deception Pass Sail & Power Squadron, will be \$50 per student. Spouses or partners sharing a book will pay an additional \$20. Successfully passing the final examination will qualify students for the Washington State Boater's Education Card issued by Parks and Recreation.

The subject matter includes basic boat handling, safety considerations, Federal and State equipment and safety requirements and nautical rules of the road. Contact Steppe Williford ([steppen@frontier.com](mailto:steppen@frontier.com)) for registration and reservations.

The **Marine Electrical Systems Course** will be offered by Deception Pass Sail & Power Squadron on Thursday nights beginning on September 15<sup>th</sup> and running to November 10<sup>th</sup>. The class will be conducted from 6PM to 8PM each night at the First United Methodist Church, 1050 SE Ireland St, Oak Harbor. This course is presented in seven chapters that start with an explanation of what electricity is, followed by discussions on boat electrical wiring, DC and AC electrical systems, galvanic and stray current corrosion, lightning protection, and ends with troubleshooting of boat electrical problems. Cost of the class to non-members of the Power Squadron will be \$60 and an additional \$30 for spouses or partners sharing material. 


